Chairman Blanchard called the meeting to order.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

#### FY 2023 HIGHLAND COUNTY BUDGET AMENDMENT

Chairman Blanchard opened a public hearing on the FY 22-23 Highland County Budget Amendment.

Ms. Lambert provided a staff report on the budget. She stated "The purpose of tonight's public hearing is to consider proposed amendments to the Highland County Budget for FY 2023 which will end on June 30. The amendments will adjust the initial estimated budgeted amount to actual revenues and expenditures.

#### **REVENUES:**

The Treasurer has revised several categories based on actual revenue collections. Ms. White, Treasurer, provided information on revenue collections.

#### **EXPENDITURES:**

There are no adjustments to the General Fund.

The School Fund has been amended from \$6,796,310 to \$6,811,339.74 or \$15,029.74 to reflect additional funding received and expended.

Department of Social Services has been amended from \$744,204 to \$778,704 or \$34,500 to reflect additional federal and state funding received and expended by that Department.

The Children Services Act Fund has been decreased to reflect actual expenditures. This fund is used for foster care, residential placements and associated costs for at risk families and youth.

The Capital Improvement Fund has been decreased to reflect actual expenditures.

When the original budget was adopted in May 2022, it was anticipated that a general fund transfer of \$328,249 might be needed at the end of the fiscal year to balance the budget if all budgeted funding was spent in each category. No transfer will be needed this year to balance the budget."

### SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL BUDGET

Ms. Lambert advised that the Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Budget needed to be amended from \$342, 905 to \$420,055 to reflect actual expenditures and it would also need a transfer of \$77,150 to balance the budget.

### EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES FUND BUDGET

Ms. Lambert advised that the Emergency Medical Services Fund Budget needed to be amended from \$451,822 to \$358,875 for revenues and amended from \$451,822 to \$290,000 to reflect actual expenditures.

Following the staff reports, Chairman Blanchard asked for public comment. There being no public comment, Chairman Blanchard closed the public hearing.

Supervisor Moyers moved to adopt the amended budgets as presented. The motion carried with the following vote.
